## DIRECTOR'S CORNER

One of the most enjoyable parts of the coaching profession is when one or a group of our former players return after graduation and shares about their experiences gained in our program. During Homecoming 2007, we had a 20 year reunion to honor our undefeated 1987 state championship football team. Of the 42 players that were a part of that team, 34 attended the day of activities. It shows the love and commitment they had for each other and the special memories they had for each other. The overall general theme for the night was how high school athletics had developed and refined their character.

During the reunion activities, one of our former players expressed how much he was enjoying teaching his son the character traits that he had learned from competing in athletics at the high school level. What he was actually saying was that the lessons he had learned from playing high school athletics had become eternal. He was influencing his son who someday would influence and teach his grandchildren. He talked of teaching lessons on how to handle failure, leadership skills, handling adversity, making commitments, handling success, importance of making sacrifices & servant hood; then he said something I will always remember; **“But no lesson is more important than teaching my son self-discipline. All other character traits are wasted if you don't have self-discipline within your life.”**

We all have “Freedom of Choice; but not Freedom of Consequences”; for every choice we make, consequences will result from those choices. I remember teaching the importance of six words to remind yourself the concept and importance of **Self-Discipline:**

- Advanced Decision Making
- Delayed Gratification
- Accountability

#### **Advanced Decision Making:**

We need to learn to make rational decisions rather than emotional decisions. The decision to make that 6:30 am workout needs to be made the evening prior not when the alarm is going off that morning. How you handle negative situations that might arise is decided prior to them happening not upon their arrival. The more we know how we are to handle a given situation prior to them happening the better off we are. Most poor decisions are spontaneous and made without thinking of the consequences of those decisions. I like to compare it to the analogy of the “Frog in Hot Water.” A frog thrown into boiling water will jump right out. If we realize the consequences of poor decisions, we would not make as many poor decisions, thus jumping right out. But that same frog placed in cool water and gradually warmed to a boil will stay right there and boil to death. A poor decision leading to another poor decision, which leads to another poor decision until all of sudden a major consequence comes about due to that collection of poor decisions. Being pro-active and learning to make decisions on how to handle given situations prior to them happening will lead to a life of better consequences.

#### **Delayed Gratification:**

We live in a world of instant gratification. We want something right now & are willing to take short cuts to get there. If you took time to reflect on those special achievements in your lives; I would bet you made sacrifices and were committed over time to accomplish them. Most positive achievements usually take time, sacrifices and commitment to accomplish. Learn to put the time & energy into something to get the quality results that last.

#### **Accountability:**

Most occasions we need help to accomplish great things. It helps to have others keep you on track and responsible. Teammates, workout partners, friends, and accountability groups are all helpful to keep you on the track toward success.

**Self-Discipline = Advanced Decision Making + Delayed Gratification + Accountability**

A good lesson for a Coach to teach, but even a better lesson to live!

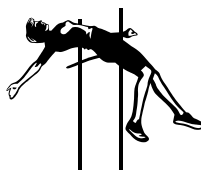
