#### **DIRECTOR'S CORNER**

#### Rob Younger, Associate Director

I umpire baseball in the spring and summer. I think that anyone who has coached, played or umpired baseball can attest to the fact that you cannot tell a baseball by its cover and it's what is inside that counts. Rather it be a cheap \$3 ball or a more expensive ball, both look very much alike. On the outside they look very much alike, but baseball coaches and players know they are very much different. The core of the baseball and the material used in winding the inside of baseballs differs greatly. You could not tell by looking on the outside or at the cover, but get inside and the truth will be made clear. What is true for a baseball is true for a coach. As coaches, we can make some differences on how we or our teams look. But over a season and particularly when we face adversity and difficult times, the truth of what we are and believe in comes out. We should be challenged to develop our players on the inside even more than we want to develop them on the outside.

At the beginning of each season, 8-10 teams in each classification possess the **tradition**, the **coaching**, and the **talent** to win a state championship. Differences among those 10 teams are very slight, often the factor that determines who finishes 1st, 4th, or 10th is a matter of character. Championship teams develop a unique chemistry based on: honesty, hard work, self-sacrifice, faith and loyalty. Good coaches understand the game. Great coaches understand the game and their athletes and how to teach both. Coaching High School Athletes gives you the opportunity to teach and learn:

- -confidence
- -courage
- -poise
- -discipline
- -perseverance
- -how to win and how to lose with dignity
- -teamwork
- -how to be great competitor
- -sportsmanship
- -integrity

A team's character and chemistry are the keys to being successful. Our short term success (season, league records) may differ from year to year, but the lasting life-long experiences that a player takes from our program should never be dependent on our record that year. Another trait we want to teach our players is; "The way you do anything is the way you do everything!" Most times when you have student/athletes successful off the playing field, they will also be successful on the field.

# NEWS FROM MAXPREPS

It seems on the surface that nothing big happens in high school sports during the summer. Coaches and MaxPreps obviously know that is not the truth.

Just as you are planning for your upcoming season, working hard to get better, we are too. And we have a big unveiling set to take place in July.

MaxPreps will be rolling out career pages for athletes, and this is a significant accomplishment as we have been working on this project for a very long time. Now student-athletes will have one page that chronicles all their high school athletic accomplishments instead of single pages for each sports season.

A student who does two sports a year each year of high school would have eight pages in the old format. No longer. Now, that student will have one spot with links to every season they are included on a roster. All photos, videos and stories will also be housed on the single career page.
