The banquets were highlighted with the presentation of twenty NFHS awards, including two National, thirteen Section 8 and five State Coaches of the Year Awards. Numerous Special Awards were given to deserving coaches, officials, athletic administrators and community members in recognition for outstanding contributions to Oregon High School Athletics. Thirteen \$1000 student scholarships were also presented, ten of those to graduating sons and daughters of OACA members. Including this year's scholarship recipients, over \$260,000 have been awarded to OACA families over the 36 years of the scholarship program. DIRECTOR'S CORNER

As the “battle” winds down vs. the toughest opponent we will ever compete against, COVID-19, it is time to hand out the “Game Awards” before we start to “game plan” for our next contest. It was a great “battle” that we won, a championship if you will, that took a total “team effort”. Like any competition against a tough opponent, it took a great game plan and an excellent scouting report to defeat it. It included many “in-game adjustments” (particularly the changes coming from OHA) to accomplish our goal. Our best post-game award, the “risk minimization effort” goes to all the players, coaches, officials and administrators for all they accomplished vs. this opponent. We congratulate everyone for battling this opponent and finishing with a victory!!!!

Our “post- game analysis” is that everyone wants to win every game. There is no question about that. But, we have a new perspective and realization that it is fun, exciting and great just to be able to get together with teammates and enjoy the awesome experience of competing and being around your friends.

Other “post-game” observations:

- Discipline and Teamwork are vital to overcome tough opponents. The discipline to follow team rules (protocols, state-mandated procedures) and the teamwork to make sure everyone stayed in compliance.
- Keeping a great “attitude of gratitude”. We heard from many coaches that expressed how much players were thankful and appreciative to get to play.
- Patience and perseverance. In order to overcome adversity, which we have vs. every opponent, it is critical to have these two components. Waiting until February to start Season 2 is a long time to keep following all the rules just hoping to play and not knowing if we were even going to be able to play!!
- Working out / staying in shape year round. Being engaged in healthy activities helps to decrease feelings of anxiety and depression which has a direct impact on minimizing suicidal thoughts. Stay in shape!!!
- This opponent displayed the enormous impact and huge reason why high school athletics are so important and vital to our student-athletes. We need athletics for the social, emotional and mental health as well as the growth and development for kids to learn the qualities to be successful members of society. This shows that we need more emphasis and support from administrators for high school athletics.

Regardless of how we word it, **CONGRATULATIONS** on a “Great Victory” and, like every sport, every season, there was a lot of great, positive lessons learned that have a huge impact on all the players’ life- long lessons teaching them “Success Skills”.

As we “Game Plan” for next year, we want to make sure that, just like for your players, we want you to be protected. We highly encourage you and all the coaches, to join the OACA. There are many great benefits but the most important is the \$2 Million liability insurance. We hear many stories every year about players and/or parents trying to sue coaches for various reasons. This coverage also covers you in the classroom if you are a high school or middle school teacher and also covers coaches in camps and at all-star games. We want everyone to be protected. For only \$50 (\$65 for Gold Card) it is really an easy decision. Information will be coming soon and you can begin signing up on July 1st.

Again, great job this year. Have a great Summer. And, thank you for all you do for your athletes, schools and communities.

OACA MEMBERSHIP 2021-2022

Membership dues have remained the same for the coming school year. Our membership dues are:

Gold Card Membership - \$65 (must be ASEP/NFHS Certified)

Retired Gold Card Membership - \$55 is offered to retired coaches who are no longer coaching or teaching and have coached at least ten (10) years at the MS, HS or college level.

Regular Membership - \$50 (does not require ASEP or NFHS Certification)

There are many benefits to being an OACA member. A \$2,000,000 liability insurance benefit that covers you for all coaching and teaching activities in/out of season, camp insurance eligibility, reduced-fee sports clinics, OACA e-newsletters, representation for each sport/class to the OSAA for the purpose of improving high school athletics, recognition at our annual awards banquet, state and national awards, eight \$1,000 student scholarships for high school graduating sons and daughters of our members, and a \$50,000 sexual abuse coverage for litigation cost to member who was unjustly accused. We are pleased to announce a new benefit for our Gold Card members as a part of our partnership with the Sheraton Portland Airport Hotel. When traveling, you are eligible for 20% off of a single night room rate including free shuttle to and from the airport and up to 14 days of free parking.

Please Note: Only the Gold Card & Retired Gold Card admits you to High School/OSAA events.

You will receive your Gold Cards electronically through an email from the OSAA Website, Subject line: "2021-22 OSAA Gold Card." The email contains a link for your card and instructions on how to save the link to your mobile device. **We recognize that some members do not have a smart phone. Membership hard copies are available for those individuals. Both the Digital and Hard Copies are valid for admission into HS/OSAA events.** If your phone is unable to process a digital card, contact our office @ 541-928-2700 or laura@oregoncoach.org.

OACA Liability Insurance Info:

The liability coverage policy period is August 1 – July 31. It covers the coach during their season, off-season workouts, and during summer activities. College and Youth Coaches are not covered by the Liability Insurance policy, the policy only covers High School and Middle School Coaches. As a 2020-21 OACA Member you are covered during this summer's activities. After July 31, our new membership year will begin and you will need to sign up again to be covered Aug. 1st, 2021-July 31st, 2022. With the summer waiver being extended through August 7th, you will want to make sure that you get yourself registered right away for the new school year so you have no lapse in your insurance.

It is in your best interest to sign up for your membership at the beginning of each membership year and take advantage of the entire membership year. It does not matter if you coach a winter or spring sport, you can sign up for your membership as soon as the new school year opens and have the benefit of your insurance for the entire membership year that also covers you when you are in the classroom.
